Sunday Reflection

Friends, on every Third Sunday of Advent the Church cannot refrain from “jumping the gun”, so to speak, by anticipating, if only briefly, the coming mood of celebration. today we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin meaning “Rejoice!” So, on this Sunday of rejoicing the rose candle is lit, the priest’s vestments lighten, and the tone of Advent shifts. All this is to remind us that even in the midst of Advent’s waiting and longing, joy breaks through. Yes, our liturgy today invites joy to overflow in us but let’s be honest: when we look around the world, joy can feel like a contradiction. Wars are persistent, innocent lives are lost daily, families continue to break up, and reports of injustice and violence dominate the news. Even in our personal lives, we carry burdens, illness, grief, and uncertainty. So, how can the Church dare to command us: Rejoice!?

Mother Church invites us to rejoice on this Sunday, not because things are wonderful, with no pain or sorrow or uncertainties, but because God is in our midst. Joy is the witness that should come out of us when we truly and freely embrace our faith. It is the reality that cannot come from my country or culture but from the fact that I know that God is here and now in my situation, in my family and in my circle of friends, and that I am known, loved and accepted by Him. Joy should be the basic mood of the Christian or as G.K Chesterton once said; “Joy is the gigantic secret of the Christian”. It should not be something artificial or forced but something that bubbles up naturally from our sharing Christ’s vision of life.

Our readings for today drive the above point home very well. In the 1st reading the Prophet Isaiah speaks to a people in exile, crushed by despair. Yet he proclaims: “The desert and the parched land will exult; the steppe will rejoice and bloom. They will see the glory of the Lord, the splendor of our God.” Joy here is not naïve optimism. It is rooted in God’s promise: that the wasteland will bloom, that the weak will be strengthened, that sorrow will be turned into everlasting joy. Isaiah reminds us that joy is not the denial of suffering but the presence of God’s saving power in the midst of it. It is the conviction that suffering does not have the last word.

And in the Gospel, John the Baptist who has given everything for the mission is now in prison. He sends his disciples to ask Jesus: “Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?” This is a question born of struggle, doubt, and pain. Even John, the great prophet, wrestles with doubt in the darkness of his cell. And Jesus responds not with a simple “yes, or no” but with signs of joy: “The blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them.” In other words: wherever Jesus is, despair is met with hope, brokenness with healing, death with life. That is the cause for joy not because the world is free of atrocities, but because God has entered into the world’s pain and is transforming it from within.

At the heart of this Gaudete Sunday is the fact that Joy is not a denial of hardship. It rather is the conviction that Christ is present, healing, and saving even when life feels like a desert. It is the courage to trust that God’s promises are true, even when we cannot yet see their fullness. Like John, we may have questions. Like Israel, we may feel exiled in our own struggles. But the joy of Christ is not brittle, it is resilient. It blooms in deserts, it sings in prisons, it shines in the darkest nights.

So how do we live this joy or be agents of Christ’s Joy. We can start by noticing the small signs of God’s presence; this can be a kind word, a healing moment, a glimpse of hope. By strengthening the weak hands and encouraging fearful hearts around us. By proclaiming good news to the poor not only materially, but even through our presence to anyone who feels forgotten or unloved. Let us always remember one thing, Joy is contagious. When we live it, we spread it.

May we always keep in mind that on Gaudete Sunday, the Church does not ask us to ignore the darkness. It asks us to light a candle in it, to rejoice not because everything is perfect, but because Emmanuel, “God with us” is near. Let our joy be defiant and prophetic. Let it say to the world around us; “You may wound us, but you cannot steal our hope. You may break our hearts, but you cannot erase the promise of Christ.
