Sunday Reflection

Friends, today we enter the final stretch of Advent. Today's Gospel brings us into the quiet drama of Joseph's life - a man whose plans were suddenly interrupted by God. Joseph had a plan and that was to marry Mary, start a family, live a simple life. But then came the news: Mary was with child, and Joseph knew the child was not his. His world collapsed. The law demanded quite harsh consequences for women in such a situation as Mary, at the very least, such a woman had to be publicly humiliated and in worst case scenario she would be stoned to death for disgracing her household. Although Joseph was a renowned observer of the law, he was not ready to give up Mary to such treatment. That is why we hear that his intention was to "divorce her quietly." And yet, in this moment of confusion, God speaks: "Do not be afraid."

What lessons does Joseph in today's Gospel teach us? In the first place, Joseph's story reminds us that life rarely goes according to our script. We may make plans, for example, career paths, family dreams, financial goals and then something happens: a diagnosis, a job loss, a move or a new responsibility which we never expected. Obviously, like Joseph, we ask: "What now?" Sometimes God's interruptions feel like detours, but in truth they are invitations to something deeper, greater, and more life-giving. Joseph amazingly accepted what seemed to be an inconvenience to teach us that at different times God may disrupt our lives especially through the voice of conscience, our normal responsibilities and demands of our various states of life or he may put little blocks in our way and things don't come out the way we wanted them to be. In such moments we must not despair, quit or grumble but always surrender and trust the hand of God. Joseph teaches us that trust means letting God rewrite the script. His "yes" allowed Jesus, Emmanuel "God with us" to enter the world.

Secondarily, Joseph teaches us that God's interruptions bring the best outcome. Just think about it; if Joseph had clung to his own plan, the story of salvation would have been very different. But by trusting God's interruption, Joseph became part of the greatest story ever told. So too in our lives: A closed door may lead to a new calling. A painful loss may open us to deeper compassion. An unexpected challenge may reveal strength we didn't know we had. God's interruptions are not meant to destroy us, but to draw us closer to His purpose. They are the moments when Emmanuel "God with us" becomes real.

Joseph also teaches us to love people the way they are. We know very well the angel of God intervened, but still humanly speaking, Joseph's pain of feeling betrayed by Mary would not go just like that. But Joseph chooses to accept Mary the way she is. With Christmas approaching, it's a good time to reflect on how we've shown love to the people around us. Is it because of their perfections or simply for who they are. Let's always remember that God did not love us because we were so perfect, but because we were broken and wounded. He loved us in our brokenness and woundedness and that's why he sent his only son, Jesus Christ to restore us to that original image which we had lost through disobedience.

Through Joseph, we are further reminded that we are simple instruments in the hands of God. Therefore, each one of us must make him/herself available as a worthy instrument to be used by God. We must be ready to cooperate with God as Mary and Joseph did, in order that the promises of God might be fulfilled in us and for those around us. Thus, today we can take a moment to ponder about the wonderful things God does for us, in us and through us.

Joseph's story is more or less our story. We all face interruptions, disappointments, and surprises. But like Joseph, we are called to trust. To believe that God's plan, though mysterious, is always for our good. As we light the fourth candle of Advent, let us imitate Joseph's quiet strength. When God's plans surprise us, may we respond with trust. When fear rises, may we hear the angel's voice: "Do not be afraid." And may we rejoice that Emmanuel "God with us" comes to dwell in our hearts.

Christmas is a time of giving as we celebrate the special gift of Jesus Christ. In the spirit of the season, we ask you to prayerfully consider bestowing a special Christmas gift to our programs. Different programs you can support include;

Religious Education - It is our Religious Education program that helps us to live and share our Catholic faith through the integration of academics, moral values, spiritual growth and prayer. Includes OCIA (Adults), Sacramental Preparation (children/youth), Bible studies, prayer groups and Vacation Bible School.

Assistance Fund - This program disburses thousands of dollars annually to help the poor in our community. By providing food, gas cards and help with utility bills, we share Christ's love with our community.

Lighting Project - Next year we are planning on redoing our lights in the church - improving functionality, supporting energy savings and enhancing worship.

SJV Catholic School - By providing a quality Catholic education, regardless of ability to pay, St. John Vianney Catholic School helps to create faithful servants of Christ.

Rectory Improvement - Part of our call to service is to care for our priests. Improvements at the rectory provide a safe home for the priests who serve our parishes.

Kathy Reisenauer Endowment - We are blessed with an endowment to help ensure the continued success of St. John Vianney parish and school. By contributing to the growth of the endowment, you help secure the financial stability of our community.


