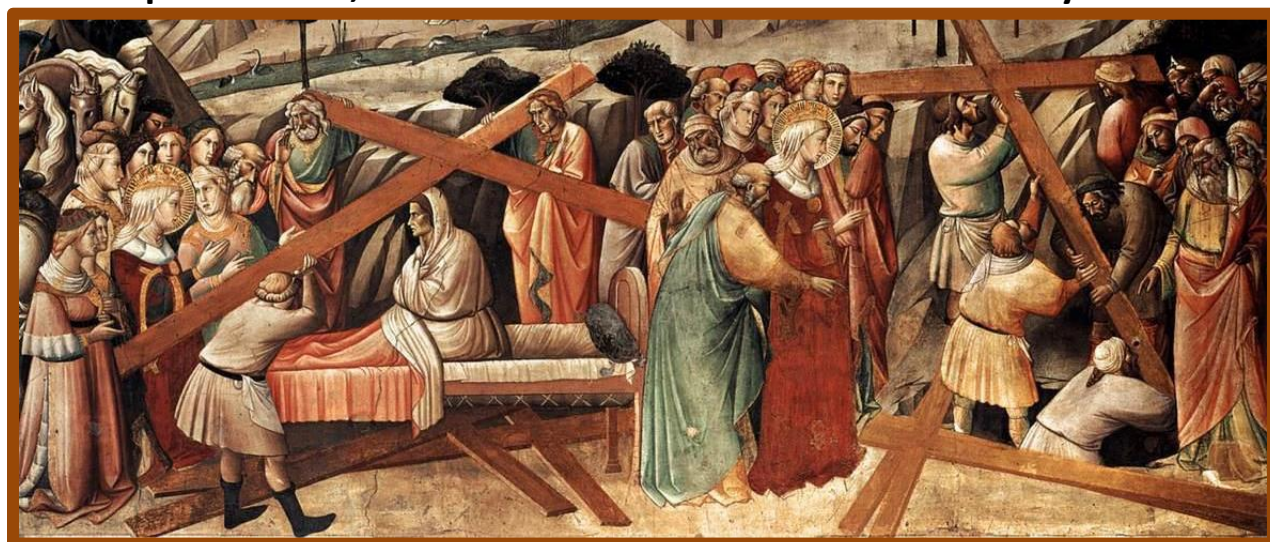

Dear parishioners and guests,

Although prayer is one of our favorite things, prayer is not generally like a brown paper package tied up with string (with all due respect to Mary Poppins). It is not always neat and tidy, contained, well-defined, and predictable. Prayer is not like following a recipe that tells us how to use certain ingredients in certain ways to produce a certain result. Prayer is not like assembling a new piece of furniture that arrives in the mail: slide these together, tighten this nut, and voila! a new end table.

If we try to fashion it into something like that, our prayer will be sterile and perfunctory.

Prayer is an act of faith. It belongs in the realm of those things that escape our complete comprehension and mastery. This must necessarily be the case because the object of prayer is God, who can never be fully in our grasp.

There may be something inside us, however, that doesn't want prayer to be so undefined. We want, at the end of our prayer time, to be able to walk away from the chapel and say, "I did it!" Memorized prayers, for all the good they offer, can bring with them a temptation to put our prayer life in a box, so to speak.

Actually, a box is a very good analogy. Imagine a box that contains a rosary, a book of prayers, a bible, and some holy cards with prayers on the back. When it's time to pray, we go to the box, pick out which items we want to use, use them, put them back in the box, and then get on with our day, thinking that we have prayed well. We *may have prayed*, but not necessarily.

We must never reduce prayer to saying words. There always has to be an interior openness to the infinite - there has to be space in our prayer life for mystery. Prayer must always engage our faith; it must always be an exercise of *belief*.

Even people who have prayed for years can be tempted to remove *faith* from prayer. We should always be on guard against that. When we pray, we stand humbly before a divine mystery. We don't have to figure it all out; in fact, we can't figure it all out. Nevertheless, God draws us into himself when we pray. Let us allow ourselves to be drawn into him, that he may accomplish his purposes in us.

There is prayer, laughter, sharing and the presence of the Holy Spirit when we meet in the ICP library each Tuesday after the 5:30 p.m. Mass.



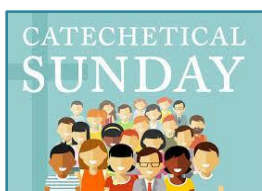

There will be a second collection during Mass this weekend for the **Urgent Relief for Survival in Gaza:** Catholic Relief Services works with church and local partners to provide relief in Gaza's deepening crisis. Families in Gaza are enduring catastrophic conditions as hostilities escalate and basic necessities for survival vanish. Reports say deaths from starvation and severe malnutrition are rising daily. More than 2 million people are now crammed into an area smaller than 17 square miles. The Ministry of Health in Gaza reports that emergency rooms are filling with people collapsing from physical depletion.

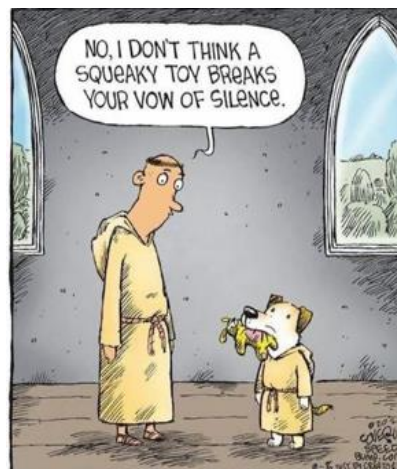


Knights of Columbus Breakfast:

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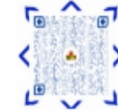
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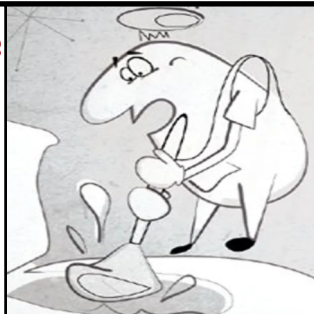
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
