Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati: Man of the Beatitudes

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati was canonized by Pope Leo XIV on September 7, 2025. Pope Benedict XVI said he was: "The best witness to the Gospel is the life of the Saints." This is true of our young Saint, especially relevant to our present world, above all young people.

The meaning of the Christian life is to live with a purpose, directed by a deep relationship with Jesus Christ that grows in love, and service of others, where you use your personal talents, moral commitments, and concrete service to make the world more humane and beautiful. One's life flourishes in relationships with others, honest work, and is shaped by courage, compassion, and truth. All this is demonstrated in Pier Giorgio's short life.

Born in Turin, Italy, on April 6, 1901 to a well-known family; his father Alfredo founded the newspaper La Stampa (still a major newspaper in Italy today) and was active in politics. Pier Giorgio joined Marian sodalities; he received permission to receive daily Communion and, from his teens, was active in the St. Vincent de Paul Society and Catholic Action, dedicating himself to helping the poor, the sick, and returning soldiers. He loved the mountains, art, music, and practical jokes; he combined an exuberant social life with austere charity and prayer. Pier Giorgio died at age 24 in 1925 and was canonized 100 years later in 2025.

His life shows faith in action; he regularly gave away money, bus fare, and toys; his charity was total, not merely almsgiving, reflecting a conviction that the poor are his masters. Prayer and the Eucharist were central; he combined devout practice with public activism in social causes and with friends, showing holiness is compatible with ordinary joys. He opposed fascism and stood with Catholic social teaching in a turbulent political time, risking reputation for justice. Pier Giorgio evangelized by example—bringing friends to Mass, Scripture, and prayer during outings and climbs—showing that transforming others often starts with ordinary relationships.



Practical ways to follow St. Pier Giorgio's example:

- 1. Serve the poor regularly. Make small, consistent sacrifices (time, money, skills) for people in need.
- 2. Root life in prayer. Make regular prayers the foundation of everyday decisions.
- 3. Live joyfully and authentically. Combine friendship, leisure, and culture with moral seriousness so faith feels attractive, not forbidding.
- 4. Stand for justice. Speak and act against injustices, informed by clear moral principles.
- 5. Use your vocation for others. Choose work or study with an eye to how it can serve people, not only personal advancement.

I recommend the following book for learning more about Pier Giorgio: "A Man of the Beatitudes: Pier Giorgio Frassati" by his sister Luciana Frassati, one year younger than Pier Giorgio, born in 1902 and died in 2007 at the age of 105. Her biography shows his life shaped by the Beatitudes, and you can buy it on Amazon.

Fr. Hartin also wrote a one-week plan modeled on Pier Giorgio Frassati's habits (prayer, service, friendship, recreation) to help you try living his example. That will be made available as an insert in this week's bulletin and on parish website.

29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - OCT 19, 2025

Gospel Reading - Luke 18:1-8

Jesus urges his disciples to pray and not lose heart, for God hears and answers prayers.

This is the first of two parables that Jesus tells in Luke 18 about prayer. (The second will be read at Mass next Sunday.) This first parable is a lesson in persistence in prayer. (Next Sunday's parable will address attitude in prayer.) While the parable seems to present prayer as nagging God for what we want, such a reading misses the point. God is not like the judge in the parable, worn down by requests and coerced to respond. The key is found in the description of the judge as corrupt and unjust. Since God can be neither, we must understand Jesus to be saying that if even an unjust judge responds to the persistence of the widow, how much more so will God listen to our prayers. God truly wants to hear our needs and respond generously. It is the final lament of Jesus that gets to the point of the parable. The lesson is about the persistence of the one who prays. God wants us to be like the persistent widow, staying in relationship with God, confident that God hears and answers prayers. Then Jesus laments, "Will such faith be found when the Son of Man comes?" In this lament, Jesus notes how easy it can be for us to lose heart.(Source: Sunday Connection - www.loyolapress.com)

OCIA sessions begin, please join us!


