
Knights of Columbus Breakfast

Sunday Reflection

Friends, today we celebrate the Feast of the Lord's Baptism, which also concludes the Christmas season. So, if you haven't yet done so, today is the right day to put down Christmas decorations. I have always shared in John the Baptist's shock that Christ should come to him for baptism! He is exceedingly stunned at this and says, "I need to be baptized by you... and yet you come to me?" We all know what has been going on in the desert; John has been preaching repentance with fire in his voice. Crowds come to him; sinners, soldiers, tax collectors, people who know they need conversion. John knows his role very well: he is the forerunner, the voice crying out in the wilderness, the one preparing the way. And then shockingly Jesus appears! Not with fanfare, not with angels, not with a heavenly spotlight, just quietly, simply, and humbly. He steps into the water to be baptized. Why would Jesus who is sinless, divine, the Son of God, submit to a baptism meant for sinners?

John expected the Messiah to stand apart but Jesus chose to stand with. John expected the Messiah to separate Himself from sin but Jesus chose to enter the very place where sin is confessed. John expected the Messiah to baptize with fire but Jesus chose to be baptized with water. Why? Because Jesus is not a distant God. He is Emmanuel, God with us. When Jesus steps into the Jordan, He is stepping into our story, our muddy waters, our sin, our confusion, our humanity. He is not baptized to be made holy but that humanity may be holy. He stands with sinners so that sinners may stand with God. He enters the water so that no human experience, no sin, no shame, no struggle will ever be outside His reach. He goes down into the water so that we can rise from it with Him.

We are further told that when Jesus rose from the waters, the heavens rend open, and the Father's voice was heard, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." This voice of the Father reveals what baptism gives us and what it truly is. Baptism is not simply a cleansing. It is a claiming, belonging, and identity. And everything spoken over Jesus is spoken over us in our baptism: You are my beloved child. I am pleased with you. You belong to me. This is the deepest truth of our lives. Baptism is therefore not a certificate, a family tradition or a photo album moment. Baptism gives us an identity, a belonging and a mission. Just as Jesus' baptism launched His public ministry, our baptism launches ours too.

So today we can pause to check if we have truly lived our baptismal identity and mission! And if not, the prophet Isaiah gives us a blueprint for that when he talks about the servant whom the Lord upholds. Isaiah says the servant will not break the bruised reed. In a world that is harsh, loud, and quick to condemn, the baptized are called to be gentle, patient, and healing. He also says, "I have made you a light to the nations." A baptized person is someone who refuses to add to the darkness, no gossip, no cruelty, no indifference but instead brings compassion, truth, and hope. The servant is also to open the eyes of the blind. This points not just to physical blindness but the blindness of despair, loneliness, or feeling unloved. A baptized person helps others see God's presence in their lives. The Lord's servant further brings freedom to captives. We all know people imprisoned by fear, addiction, shame, or grief. Our baptism calls us to walk with them, to be instruments of freedom.

Today, as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we pray that we hear the Father's voice again: "You are my beloved. You are mine. Live as my child." And may that identity shape every choice, every relationship, every moment of our lives throughout this year.
