

Sunday Reflection

Friends, today we begin the Sermon on the Mountain and it begins with Jesus' famous teaching called the "beatitudes". The beatitudes in a special way embodies the personal qualities expected of Jesus' disciples. Let us reflect on the meaning of each;

Blessed are the poor in spirit; here Jesus does not extol the virtue of poverty neither does he spiritualize the meaning of poverty. The poor in the Bible are not just the materially destitute, but all those who in their need turn to God. Poor in spirit are those who clearly acknowledge that they depend totally on God as their ultimate source of security.

Blessed are those who mourn; again here we think not just of those who grieve for the pain in their lives. Rather it points to those who feel a deep sorrow for the evils and injustices of this world, a continuing power of sin and death in the world. In other words, they mourn not just for their own pain but feel the pain of the good that ought to be done and its never done. Such people are in solidarity with all those who are the victims of "man's inhumanity to man".

Blessed are the meek; this also means to be gentle or kind. It should never be mistaken to mean wimpishness, weakness or cowardice. Meekness or gentleness is the ability to be angry with the right people about the right things at the right time to the right degree. It is the very opposite of arrogance, bullying and violent manipulation. It embodies one's ability to accomplish what is right without harming someone's human dignity.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness; while some societies may have people who only hunger and thirst to have the goods of this world for themselves, there are those whose major concern is the restoration of true justice and peace in societies. It is to the latter that Jesus points to as being hungry and thirsty for righteousness.

Blessed are the merciful; This is not just pity or sympathy but a deep-down compassion and empathy, a real entering into the pain that others are experiencing. This points to the fact that mercy is not simply an inner emotional feeling, instead it is expressed in concrete acts to alleviate the suffering of others. It is a motivation for action. That is why whenever Jesus had mercy on someone, He didn't just feel sorry for them or offer to pray for them, He actually did something to help them.

Blessed are the pure in heart; this goes beyond body purity. It points to being single minded in our devotion to God. It calls for not being divided or conflicted in our allegiance to God, i.e. trying to please God and human beings. It equally means that, while we may have mixed motives for our various actions or behavior, we always allow our desire to do God's will to be the determining motive.

Blessed are the peacemakers; the peace Jesus talks about here, isn't necessarily an absence of hostilities or violence. Peace is the result of right relationship with God, others, the world and ourselves. It embodies the fulness of God's gifts. There cannot be peace where there is prejudice, discrimination, or exploitation.

Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake; by this beatitude, Jesus is not rejoicing in oppression or asking us to seek for or inflict pain on ourselves in order to be blessed. Rather, He applauds those who for the sake of the Gospel and a deeper desire to bring justice and truthfulness into the world will encounter pain.

To sum it up, in the beatitudes, Jesus simply reverses our "natural" assumption that happiness lies in riches, power, pleasure, and comfort. Thus, we ought to pray for God's grace to help us live this life of beatitudes which is the perfect measure of Christian life.
