Sunday Reflection

Friends, on this Sixth Sunday in Ordinary time, we continue to reflect on Jesus' teaching famously known as the sermon on the mountain. The Gospel reading for last Sunday put a big emphasis on what we do or on the actions that's on the outside. Jesus said, *"you are the salt of the earth... you are the light of the world"*. These statements of our Lord cautioned us, His followers, to pay attention to what we do, how we do it, and so on. This weekend, Jesus shifts gears and He focuses our attention to what goes on in the inside of our hearts and our minds. Jesus wants us to do the right things externally, but He equally wants the right disposition in our hearts and our minds because what happens in there, is often manifested in our speech and actions. He says, *"unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven"*.

The Scribes were known for their expertise in scripture and the law. This they followed to the letter and understood it to be the basis for all religion. They were very upright citizens as such, they paid their debts, they observed their religious rituals, and they were leaders of the community. The Scribes and the Pharisees kept the Law and the Commandments very carefully. But Jesus would say that, although they observed the external requirements of the Law, they did not have the spirit which is the foundation of the Law: to love God and to love the neighbor as oneself. Jesus isn't pleased with them because, as they were simply strict followers of the rules and made sure everybody does the same, their hearts were totally on something different. In the mind of Jesus, righteousness goes beyond the mere observing of the commandments, it is what is in my heart and mind that matters. That is why he also repeatedly says, *"You have heard that it was said, You shall not kill..., commit adultery..., divorce..., or take false oaths..., But I say to you..."*.

One may never be convicted of Murder, or physically hurting another but carrying on anger, resentment, and deep-seated hatred against another person, is silently hurting him or her from within. One may not use a gun or a knife to bring harm to another person, but slandering, and use of abusive language can be enough to destroy their reputation. One may never be convicted of adultery, but carrying on lustful feelings in the heart or using another as an object for pleasure and self-indulgence is equally damaging. One may never be convicted of theft, but he can rob another person's dignity in the eyes of others by gossiping. What Jesus is asking of us today, is indeed to be the light and salt of the earth in all our actions, with pure motives and intentions from the heart. We ought to strive to put on a clean record on the outside but also a clean or pure heart inside. Obedience to the minimum requirements of the law is not enough but love which springs from the goodness of the heart is what Jesus desires from us. In other words, our faith is not a checklist of rules but a relationship with the living and loving God plus the people around us.
