Sunday Reflection

Friends, on this Second Sunday of Lent, we reflect on the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor in the presence of his apostles, Peter, James, and John. A deeper reflection into this story, reveals the transfiguration is not simply a revelation of the divine glory hidden in Jesus, but it is also closely tied to Jesus' death and resurrection. Immediately preceding the transfiguration, Jesus warned His apostles that He would be rejected by the leaders, arrested, tortured, and condemned to death and when coming down the mountain after the event, He cautioned those with Him not tell anyone what they had experienced until He had risen from the dead.

The news about the pending death of Jesus, must have terrified the apostles greatly. This moment was therefore to help them remain strong when the time came to face the mountain of Calvary. It was also an affirmation to the apostles and for us that, the glory, honor, and exaltation they attributed to Jesus as the Messiah is real and the same awaits them if they persevere in following Jesus to the end.

Perhaps Peter thought that this moment of glory is the real destination of a life of faith, and discipleship as opposed to the suffering, betrayal, and death that awaited Jesus in Jerusalem earlier foretold. That's why he expressed the desire to stay and build tents; *"Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."* Peter doesn't want to go down the mountain because this will mean to lose this place of comfort and glory. He is also fully aware of what awaits Jesus and the group of his immediate followers the moment they step foot in Jerusalem. Sometimes we can be like Peter when we don't want to take the next step in our faith because of the discomfort or challenges it may bring. We try and do whatever it takes to avoid painful situations. This is a reminder for us that, Jesus calls us to a discipleship which doesn't stop at a place that is comfortable but one that faithfully follows wherever He goes and sends us.

Being on the mountain was a wonderful experience, but Jesus came down from it to continue his ministry of being present to the people in their pains and sorrows, in their fears and anxieties, in their sicknesses and disabilities and above all in their sinfulness. And He calls us to follow Him in doing the same especially during this time of Lent. Let us pray for God's grace to persevere in the good works of charity, prayer and denying ourselves as to celebrate worthily the resurrection of our Lord.
