SUNDAY REFLECTION

Friends, the readings for this Sunday invite us into a sacred reflection on the power of gratitude, not just as a polite gesture, but as a transformative response to God's healing love. The First Reading, recounts Naaman, a foreign military commander afflicted with leprosy. He comes to Israel seeking healing, and after some initial hesitation, he humbles himself and bathes in the Jordan River as instructed. His skin is restored, but more importantly, his heart is changed. Naaman returns to Elisha not just to say thank you, but to profess faith in the God of Israel. His gratitude becomes a doorway to conversion.

In the Gospel, Jesus heals ten lepers. All are physically restored, but only one, a Samaritan, returns to give thanks. Jesus marvels: "Were not ten made clean? Where are the other nine?" The Samaritan's gratitude sets him apart. But he doesn't just receive healing; he also receives salvation. Jesus tells him, "Your faith has saved you." What then is the difference between being healed and being saved? Healing touches the body. Salvation transforms the soul. And gratitude is the bridge between the two.

In this Gospel passage, Jesus doesn't condemn the nine lepers. He simply notices their absence. And in doing so, He invites us to be the ones who returns. The ones who kneel. The ones who says, "Thank you, Lord." So today we are called upon to cultivate hearts that return to God not just when we need something, but when we've received something. We are further reminded to teach our children not just to express politeness by saying "please," but also to routinely express appreciation by saying "thank you."

Other than a call to be always grateful for the blessings in our lives, we are compelled to ask ourselves; who is the "leper" today and how have we treated him/her? In Jesus' time, lepers were the ultimate outsiders: physically afflicted, socially exiled, spiritually stigmatized. They lived on the margins, unseen and untouched. Today, the "leper" might not have a skin disease, but they still bear the wounds of exclusion. They might be: the homeless person we pass without eye contact. The refugee or immigrant navigating suspicion and bureaucracy. The addict, the mentally ill, the formerly incarcerated. The elderly and the sick. The single mother judged more than supported. The person grieving silently while the world moves on. Or that unborn baby who is seen as a burden other than a blessing. These are the ones society often pushes to the edges. And like the lepers in the Gospel, they cry out not always with words, but with presence, with silence, with longing: "Have mercy on me."

How have we approached and interacted with them? For most part we have responded by keeping our distance. We've let fear, discomfort, or indifference build walls. We've labeled, avoided, or even spiritualized our silence: "I'll pray for them," we say, without ever learning their name. But today Jesus teaches us something of great importance. He didn't just heal the lepers, He saw them. He walked toward them. He touched them. And He praised the one who returned with gratitude, even though he was a Samaritan, doubly marginalized. As Church, we're called to do the same. To see. To walk toward. To touch not just with hands, but with presence, dignity, and love.
