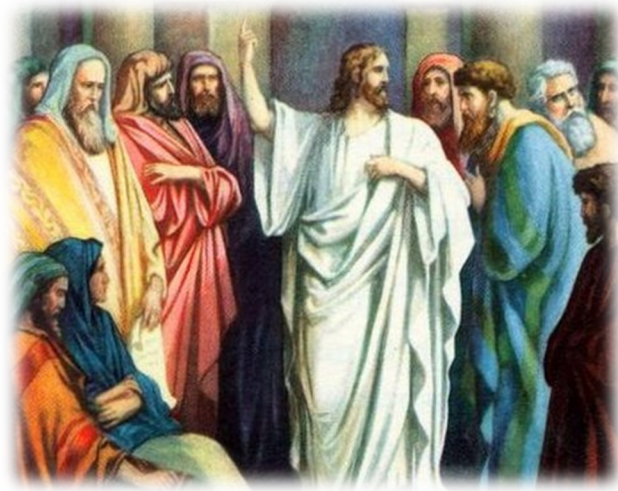

## SUNDAY REFLECTION

Friends, as we approach the end of the liturgical year, the Church invites us to reflect on the “end”. In other words, keep the end in sight. Talking about the end of all things always sparks different reactions among individuals and societies in general. These can be in form of fear, confusion, despair, anger, resentment and sometimes joy. But our readings today invite us to reflect on the reality of end of things not with fear, but with faith, perseverance, and vigilance.

In the Gospel, Jesus stands before the grandeur of the Temple, admired by many for its beauty and splendor and He warns: “All that you see here, the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone.” He also speaks of wars, earthquakes, famines, persecutions. It’s not exactly comforting. But Jesus isn’t trying to scare us, instead He’s preparing us. He’s saying: Don’t be dazzled by what is temporary. Don’t be shaken by what is passing but rather focus to what is eternal. Yes, the end will come, and not just the end of the world, but the end of our own lives, our own plans, our own temples. But in that end, there is a promise: “By your perseverance you will secure your lives.”

Our second reading narrates what was going on among the Thessalonians which also compelled St. Paul to write his second letter. After the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus into heaven, his followers always anticipated his return to be so soon. His return was also thought to be the end of the world. Since many were so convinced that the end was near, they were just sitting doing nothing and waiting for the Lord to come and were even urging others to do the same; “doing no work themselves but interfering in everyone else’s.” Here St. Paul gives a different kind of warning not about cosmic upheaval, but about spiritual laziness. He reminds the Thessalonians and us today that having the end in sight is not an excuse to check out, it’s a reason to lean in. To live with purpose. To work with dignity and to serve with love.

So, we ask ourselves today, what does it mean to live with the end in sight? It means we don’t panic when the world shakes. We plant seeds anyway. It means we don’t stop praying, working, loving just because things feel uncertain. It means we live each day as if it matters. Because it does. And in the end, it’s not the temple stones that matter, nor is it the things that we tend to fix our attention on so much, i.e achievements, health, beauty, pleasure, wealth, physical outlook but it’s the salvation of our souls. May we remember that sometimes, the end isn’t missed because we’re afraid it’s missed because we’re distracted and many times, what distracts us are the things that do not last.
