## SUNDAY REFLECTION

Friends, Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe, a feast that also crowns our liturgical year C. In Uganda where I come from, as in many parts of the world, a king is revered. He is adorned in royal robes, seated on a throne, and surrounded by servants. A king is served, honored, and often placed above the people he leads. A king's palace is always portrayed as a symbol of power, prestige, and privilege. Again, in Uganda, when the king enters, people rise, they bow, they bring gifts. But today's readings especially the Gospel confront us with a paradox. Jesus, our true King, is hanging on a cross. Mocked by soldiers, jeered by leaders, crucified between criminals. No crown of gold, but thorns. No throne, but a wooden beam. No royal robes, but stripped garments. And yet, it is here on the cross that His kingship is most fully revealed especially through the words of the "good thief", "Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom." How then can the Cross, a sign of utter defeat, also be the sign of our King's everlasting victory?

Christ is King but His kingship is not of this world. In other words, Christ's Kingdom begins in this world, but it is not a temporal one of power and opulence but an eternal one of truth, life, holiness, grace, justice, love, and peace. Here is a beautiful explanation given by Gerald Darring. The Kingdom of God is a space. It exists in every home where parents and children love each other. It exists in every region and country that cares for its weak and vulnerable. It exists in every parish that reaches out to the needy. The Kingdom of God is a time. It happens whenever someone feeds a hungry person, or shelters a homeless person, or shows care to a neglected person. It happens whenever we overturn an unjust law, or correct an injustice, or avert a war. It happens whenever people join in the struggle to overcome poverty, to erase ignorance, to pass on the Faith.

On this Sunday, the church therefore gives us an opportunity to assess our commitment to Christ our King. He cannot be our King if we do not listen to Him, love Him, serve Him, and follow Him. We belong to His Kingdom only when we try to walk with Him, when we try to live our lives fully in the spirit of the Gospel and when that Gospel spirit penetrates every facet of our living. To serve Christ's kingship is not to build Him a palace, but to build a home for the homeless. It is not to bring Him gold, but to bring comfort to the grieving. It is not to sing His praises only in church, but to speak up for the voiceless in our communities. May we not only proclaim Christ as King with our lips, but enthroned Him in our hearts by the way we live, love, and serve.


