THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Pastor's Corner —My brothers and sisters in Christ, May the Lord continue to bless our families and our parish community!

Today we celebrate the beautiful Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord—a feast of light, journey, and revelation. The word epiphany means “manifestation.” On this day, God reveals Himself not only to Israel, but to all nations. Christ is shown as Savior of the whole world . 

The prophet Isaiah proclaims with hope: “Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come; the glory of the Lord shines upon you.” This light is not meant to be hidden or kept for a few. It is a light that draws people from every direction. Kings, nations, and travelers are attracted to it. The Epiphany reminds us that the Church exists to shine with this light—to reflect Christ so clearly that others are drawn toward Him.

In the Gospel, we encounter the Magi. They are not kings of Israel, not scholars of the Law, but seekers—foreigners guided by a star and by an open heart. They travel far, risk much, and persevere through uncertainty because they are searching for truth. Their journey teaches us that faith often begins with a longing placed by God within the human heart. When they finally encounter the Child Jesus, they fall down in worship and offer their gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh—symbols of kingship, divinity, and sacrifice.

Saint Paul, in his Letter to the Ephesians, tells us that this mystery was once hidden but is now revealed: in Christ, all people are invited to share in God’s promise. No one is excluded. No culture, language, or past places us beyond the reach of God’s grace.

The Epiphany invites us to ask important questions: What star is God using to lead us closer to Him today? Are we willing, like the Magi, to rise and follow—even when the journey is uncomfortable or unfamiliar? And perhaps most importantly, do others see the light of Christ shining through us?

As members of St. Joseph’s and St. Anthony’s communities, we are called not only to adore Christ but also to make Him known. Through our kindness, our service to the poor, our patience, forgiveness, and love, we become stars pointing others to Jesus.

May this feast renew our faith, widen our hearts, and strengthen our mission. Let us rise up in splendor, for Christ our Light has come. **Merry Christmas Season!**

May God bless our Parish! May the Lord continue to provide us with deeper faith and love in the Eucharist!
